Welcome: Anthony Armando opened the meeting and updated the committee on a variety of projects and then opened discussions for new business amongst committee members:

I. Event Recaps and Projects:

SID Business Improvement Program & Facade Improvement Program: The committee was updated about additional eligible businesses that have been recently funded. Also, new businesses were contacted to be included in the grant funding application.

NJ Arts & Music Express held on Saturday, May 4th, went well for an inaugural event, even with a cool and overcast day and then rain near the end of the event time. The Coffee Box had musicians performing all day, UCPAC had a Star Wars screening, and the Arts District Park mural dedication ceremony was well attended. The Cherry Street vendor market and the art galleries reported good traffic. A committee member suggested that next year, please create maps that are distributed to the shops and have an info table near Cherry Street. Also relayed was that no one was receiving visitors at the other townships and not many people used the train. Those who did take the train said they were stuck in Avenel for two hours and as the stop schedule was sparse after 12:00pm.

Action: Anthony will reach out to Avenel to discuss a post-mortem with the organizers of the other townships.

II. Upcoming Projects & Events:

- a. New Public Art Incentive Grant Program will be funded directly from a SID Grant to encourage new murals, sculptures or light art into Rahway. Installation requirements are that they art would need to be visible from a public gathering standpoint. The grant will be available starting on August 1st.
- b. The Extra Space Storage on 2255 Elizabeth Avenue, will have a mural painted on a façade wall starting on Monday, July 1st.
- c. The Latin Stroll is scheduled for Saturday, June 22nd with four stroll locations. NJ Salsa is hosting the event which starts at the Recreation center, with live musicians accompanying participants to three locations Romero's, The Waiting Room and the Lounge at the Watt Hotel.

- d. The Soiree En Blanc dining event is scheduled for Sunday, August 25th, with a rain date of Sept. 1st.
- e. Small Business Saturday planning starts up in late August.

- g. Social Media and Branding Program: Fourteen small businesses applied for a grant that allowed a social medial specialist to work with three finalists. The chosen businesses were: Wet Ticket, Millie & Joy and Sabor Peruano. Check out new postings from each business soon to see the difference.

III. Old Business:

Anthony updated the committee that the new wayfinding signage discussed at a prior meeting is moving forward. He will update the members at the next committee meeting.

IV. Open Discussion / New Business:

Anthony updated the committee about the East Cherry Street Streetscape construction which would start in 2025. The plan was altered and all businesses are invited to a public presentation about the changes to the design which will be held on June 14th at 10:00am at the Rahway Public Library auditorium.

Save the date: UCPAC will be holding a new fundraiser event called Flight Night on Thursday, October 10th, they will be looking for auction items.

The owners of the Rahway National building on 1420 Irving Street are presenting at the planning board on June 12th to seek approval to allow a restaurant, including an outdoor rooftop, and music venue to operate at the former bank building downtown.
